Hall of Fame Nominee Criteria

Eligibility Guidelines for Induction

The Florida Quarter Horse Association Hall of Fame recognizes persons and horses whose achievements and contributions have significantly impacted the Florida Quarter Horse Association. Nominees should demonstrate excellence in breeding, showing, racing, training, or promoting American Quarter Horses within the state and beyond. Candidates must have exhibited integrity, sportsmanship, and dedication to the advancement of the industry.

- Nominees may include breeders, trainers, owners, exhibitors, or administrators. Horses must be Florida bred and recognized through the American Quarter Horse Association breed registry.
- Nominees must be in good standing with the Florida Quarter Horse Association.
- Achievements for individuals or horses should be sustained for many years and notable, with a positive influence on the Florida Quarter Horse Association.
- Nominees must have contributed to the association's mission and growth through leadership, innovation, or service.
- Both living and posthumous nominations are accepted for humans. Horses must be deceased. All nominations should include supporting documentation outlining accomplishments and contributions.
- Nominees are considered for induction for up to three years. If a nominee is not selected during that time, they will rotate off. After a three year waiting period, the horse or human may be re-nominated for future consideration.
- Up to four humans and one horse may be inducted into the Florida Quarter Horse Hall of Fame each year.

Final selection is made by the Hall of Fame committee, which reviews all submissions for merit and alignment with the association's values.
